FAQs

The Restrooms: Take a left as you leave the worship space. Our main bathrooms are on the right. Follow the signs around the corner for individual, accessible bathrooms.

Standing, Sitting & Kneeling: Traditionally worshipers stand when they sing, stand or kneel during prayer, and sit when they are listening. We give you prompts in the bulletin so you know what others might be doing, but please feel free to stand, sit or kneel at any time during the service.

Communion: All are welcome.

Bulletin Guide: Congregational responses are in bolded text following the **C**:. Worship Leaders will say the words in regular text. Descriptions and prompts are in small italic text. Please let us know if there is any other information you think would be helpful.

Nursery: Children are always welcome in worship. We have kid-friendly activity bags hanging in the entrance hall—with coloring books, crayons, and more.

Standing Confession and Forgiveness

Blessed be the holy Trinity, \pm one God, our creator, our protector, our wellspring of life.

C: Amen

Trusting that God receives our words and the meditations of our hearts, let us confess our sin.

Silence is kept for reflection.

Standing/Kneeling Merciful God,

C: you speak blessing and compassion into the world. Forgive us for the ways we act with judgment, cruelty, or indifference. We ignore the needs of our neighbors; we resist your call to oppose injustice; we give in to scarcity and fear; we assume the worst about one another. Cleanse us from our faults and release us from their grasp. Show us your lovingkindness. Restore our hearts and repair your world, that we may live in Christ's ways.

God proclaims these words of assurance: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you. I have called you by name. You are mine." In + Christ, you are forgiven. In the Spirit, you are made free. Refreshed by the waters of mercy, live anew as beloved children of God.

Our Communion Service:

The Holy Spirit comes to us in our **gathering** around the means of grace—the saving **Word** of God and the sacraments. From the **meal** at the communion table where Jesus Christ comes with forgiveness, life, and salvation, God sends us out to share the good news and to care for those in need.

Confession:

We begin worship with confession. Because of God's mercy we are free to confess ways we have harmed God or one another. God's word of forgiveness boldly opens the door to be in God's presence.

→ We use the sign of the cross as a remembrance of baptism and to proclaim the gifts of God's promise in baptism.




Standing Canticle of Praise



Seated Second Reading | 1st Corinthians 15:12-20

A reading from 1st Corinthians

¹² Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; ¹⁴ and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. ¹⁵ We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are


not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. ¹⁷ If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. ¹⁹ If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. ²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

¹⁷ [Jesus] came down with [the twelve] and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. ¹⁸ They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. ¹⁹ And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them. ²⁰ Then he looked up at his disciples and said:

"Blessed are you who are poor,

for yours is the kingdom of God.

²¹ "Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.

"Blessed are you who weep now,




Thanksgiving at the Table
